### **Music Notes**

For the offertory today, you will hear a haunting arrangement of "If You But Trust in God to Guide" by George Neumark, #510 in our hymnal.

Georg Neumark (1621-1681) lived during the time of the Thirty Years' War, when social and economic conditions were deplorable. On his way to Konigsberg to study at the university, traveling in the comparative safety of a group of merchants, he was robbed of nearly all his possessions. The next two years he spent looking for work. When he had saved enough money he returned to the University to study only to lose all his belongings in a fire. Despite his personal suffering Neumark wrote many hymns in which he expressed his absolute trust in God.
