"Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" is a classic Easter hymn by the great hymn writer Charles Wesley. It first appeared in a collection by John and Charles Wesley called Hymns and Sacred Poems (1739) without the "alleluia's," which were added in the early 19th century. This is a hymn in praise of the power of Christ. It begins with both heaven and earth singing praise that Christ has won the battle and defeated death. The final stanza declares that if we are indeed made like Christ and follow His example then we can have everlasting life (John 3:16) This is empowering to us and others, to know that Christ died for us, and that his power enables us to overcome suffering, and death, just like He did.
