Music Notes

Now Thank We All Our God - The earliest projected date for this hymn is 1636. Martin Rinckart was an accomplished musician and a Lutheran pastor in the city of Eilenburg during the Thirty Years' War. During this time plague and famine came and Martin, being one of the last surviving ministers would perform nearly fifty funerals a day (including his wife). In addition he used personal resources to take care of refugees. He wrote these words as a blessing for meager food on his table. While living in a world dominated by death he was able to write this majestic hymn of gratitude. It is a reminder for us that we can be thankful to God at all times and in all circumstances.
